1	SEC. 2. FULL YEAR SUPPLY OF CONTRACEPTIVE PILLS,
2	TRANSDERMAL PATCHES, AND VAGINAL

4	(a) Full Year Supply.—Subchapter II of chapter
5	17 of title 38, United States Code, is amended by inserting
6	after section 1720I the following new section:
7	"§ 1720J. Full year supply of contraceptive pills,
8	transdermal patches, and vaginal rings
9	"(a) REQUEST FOR FULL YEAR SUPPLY.—The Sec-
10	retary shall ensure that a veteran who is enrolled in the
11	system of annual patient enrollment under section 1705
12	of this title and who receives a prescription for contracep-
13	tive pills, transdermal patches, or vaginal rings may, upon
14	request, fill such prescription as a full year supply.
15	"(b) Notice.—A veteran described in subsection (a)
16	shall be notified of the option for a full year supply de-
17	scribed in that subsection at the time at which the pre-
18	scription is issued.".
19	(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
20	at the beginning of such subchapter is amended by insert-
21	ing after the item relating to section $1720I$ the following
22	new item:

"1720J. Full year supply of contraceptive pills, transdermal patches, and vaginal rings.".
