8 (2) by striking the third sentence and inserting 9 the following: "In this Act, the terms 'Indian tribe' 10 and 'tribe' mean any Indian or Alaska Native tribe, 11 band, nation, pueblo, village, or community that the 12 Secretary of the Interior acknowledges to exist as an 13 Indian tribe.".
