3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 44 of title 18, United

4 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-

5 lowing:

6 "§ 935. License to own firearms and ammunition

7 "(a) IN GENERAL.—Except as otherwise provided in

8 this section, it shall be unlawful for any individual who

1	is not licensed under this section to knowingly purchase,
2	acquire, or possess a firearm or ammunition.
3	"(b) ELIGIBILITY.—An individual shall be eligible to
4	receive a license under this section if the individual—
5	"(1) has attained 21 years of age;
6	"(2) has completed training in firearms safety,
7	including—
8	"(A) a written test, to demonstrate knowl-
9	edge of applicable firearms laws;
10	"(B) hands-on testing, including firing
11	testing, to demonstrate safe use of a firearm;
12	"(C) as part of the process for applying for
13	such a license—
14	"(i) has submitted to a background
15	investigation and criminal history check of
16	the individual, including a background
17	check using the National Instant Criminal
18	Background Check System, to ensure the
19	individual is not prohibited from possessing
20	a firearm under subsection (g) or (n) of
21	section 922; and
22	"(ii) has submitted a photograph of
23	the individual;
24	"(D) has not been determined by a court,
25	in accordance with subsection $(c)(5)$, to be un-

1	suitable to be issued a Federal firearm owner's
2	license; and
3	"(E) is not otherwise prohibited by Fed-
4	eral, State, Tribal, or local law from possessing
5	a firearm.
6	"(c) Establishment of Federal Firearm
7	Owner's License.—
8	"(1) IN GENERAL.—The Attorney General shall
9	issue a Federal firearm owner's license to any indi-
10	vidual who is eligible under subsection (b).
11	"(2) Issuance of license or notice of de-
12	NIAL.—Not later than 40 days after the date on
13	which an individual submits an application for a
14	Federal firearm owner's license under this section,
15	the Attorney General shall—
16	"(A) determine whether the individual is
17	eligible to possess a license under this section;
18	and
19	"(B) based on the determination under
20	subparagraph (A)—
21	"(i) issue a Federal firearm owner's
22	license to the individual; or
23	"(ii) provide written notice to the in-
24	dividual of—

1	"(I) the determination that the
2	individual is ineligible to possess such
3	a license based on the requirements
4	described in subsection (b), which
5	shall include an explanation for the
6	determination; or
7	"(II) a petition filed under para-
8	graph (5) .
9	"(3) EXPIRATION.—A Federal firearm owner's
10	license issued under this section shall expire on the
11	date that is 10 years after the date on which the li-
12	cense was issued.
13	"(4) Renewal of license.—
14	"(A) IN GENERAL.—A Federal firearm
15	owner's license issued under this section may be
16	renewed at the end of the 10-year period de-
17	scribed in paragraph (3).
18	"(B) REQUIREMENTS.—The process for
19	renewal of a Federal firearm owner's license
20	under subparagraph (A) shall include—
21	"(i) an up-to-date background inves-
22	tigation and criminal history check of the
23	individual; and
24	"(ii) a recent photograph of the indi-
25	vidual.

1	"(C) ISSUANCE OF RENEWAL OR NOTICE
2	OF DENIAL.—Not later than 40 days after the
3	date on which an individual submits an applica-
4	tion for a renewal of a Federal firearm owner's
5	license under this paragraph, the Attorney Gen-
6	eral shall—
7	"(i) issue a renewed Federal firearm
8	owner's license to the individual; or
9	"(ii) provide written notice to the in-
10	dividual of—
11	"(I) the determination that the
12	individual is ineligible to possess such
13	a license based on the requirements
14	described in subsection (b), which
15	shall include an explanation for the
16	determination; or
17	"(II) a petition filed under para-
18	graph (5) .
19	"(5) ATF DETERMINATION OF
20	UNSUITABILITY.—
21	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The Director of the
22	Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Ex-
23	plosives may file a petition, which shall contain
24	a written statement of the reasons supporting
25	the finding required under subparagraph (D),

"(ii) other existing factors that sug-
gest that the individual could potentially
create a risk to public safety or significant
risk of suicide.
"(E) Notice of determination.—If a
court finds an individual is unsuitable to pos-
sess a Federal firearm owner's license, the
court shall notify the applicant in writing, set-
ting forth the specific reasons for such deter-
mination.
"(6) REVIEW.—A determination of the Director
of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and
Explosives or a district court of the United States
under this subparagraph may be appealed to the ap-
propriate court of the United States.
"(d) Exceptions.—

1	"(1) Previously possessed firearms.—Sub-
2	section (a) shall not apply to the possession of any
3	firearm or ammunition by an individual who other-
4	wise lawfully possessed the firearm or ammunition
5	under Federal law on the date on which the Attor-

8	"(2) STATE LICENSES.—
9	"(A) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (a) shall
10	not apply to an individual in a State if the At-
11	torney General determines that the State—

13	a State firearm owner's license to eligible
14	individuals in the State that is substan-
15	tially similar to the requirements of sub-
16	section (b); and
17	"(ii) provides to the Attorney General

22	"(B) PUBLICATION OF LIST OF QUALI-
23	FYING STATES.—

12	AND IMPORTERS.—Subsection (a) shall not apply to
13	an individual who is a licensed dealer, licensed man-
14	ufacturer, or licensed importer.
15	"(4) Agencies and law enforcement offi-
16	CERS.—
17	"(A) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (a) shall
18	not apply to—
19	"(i) the importation for, manufacture
20	for, sale to, transfer to, or possession by
21	the United States or a department or
22	agency of the United States or a State or
23	a department, agency, or political subdivi-
24	sion of a State, or a sale or transfer to or
25	possession by a qualified law enforcement

1	officer employed by the United States or a
2	department or agency of the United States
3	or a State or a department, agency, or po-
4	litical subdivision of a State, for purposes
5	of law enforcement (whether on or off
6	duty), or a sale or transfer to or possession
7	by a campus law enforcement officer for
8	purposes of law enforcement (whether on
9	or off duty); or
10	"(ii) the importation for, or sale or
11	transfer to a licensee under title I of the
12	Atomic Energy Act of 1954 (42 U.S.C.
13	2011 et seq.) for purposes of establishing
14	and maintaining an on-site physical protec-
15	tion system and security organization re-
16	quired by Federal law, or possession by an
17	employee or contractor of such licensee on-
18	site for such purposes or off-site for pur-
19	poses of licensee-authorized training or
20	transportation of nuclear materials.
21	"(B) DEFINITION.—For purposes of sub-
22	paragraph (A), the term 'campus law enforce-
23	ment officer' means an individual who is—
24	"(i) employed by a private institution
25	of higher education that is eligible for

1	funding under title IV of the Higher Edu-
2	cation Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1070 et
3	seq.);
4	"(ii) responsible for the prevention or
5	investigation of crime involving injury to
6	persons or property, including apprehen-
7	sion or detention of persons for such
8	crimes;
9	"(iii) authorized by Federal, State, or
10	local law to carry a firearm, execute search
11	warrants, and make arrests; and
12	"(iv) recognized, commissioned, or
13	certified by a government entity as a law
14	enforcement officer.
15	"(e) Prohibition of Straw Purchasing.—It shall
16	be unlawful for any person to willfully use a valid Federal
17	or State firearm license to purchase a firearm or ammuni-
18	tion on behalf of another individual, regardless of whether
19	the other individual has a valid Federal or State firearm
20	license.
21	"(f) PENALTIES.—Any person who violates sub-
22	section (a) or (e) shall be imprisoned not more than 2
23	years, fined in accordance with this title, or both.
24	"(g) DATABASE.—The Attorney General shall estab-
25	lish an electronic database, which shall be accessible by

Federal, State, local, and Tribal law enforcement agencies
 and licensed dealers, through which a licensed dealer may
 verify the validity of a Federal firearm owner's license
 issued under this section.

5 "(h) REVOCATION OF LICENSES.—

6 "(1) IN GENERAL.—The Attorney General shall 7 revoke the Federal firearm owner's license issued to 8 an individual under this section upon the occurrence 9 of any event that would have disqualified the indi-10 vidual from being issued or renewed a Federal fire-11 arm owner's license under this section or for a viola-12 tion of a restriction provided under this section.

13 "(2) REQUIRED NOTICE.—Upon revocation of a
14 Federal firearm owner's license under paragraph
15 (1), the Attorney General shall provide written no16 tice of such revocation to the individual to whom the
17 license was issued.

18 "(3) Appeal of revocation.—

"(A) IN GENERAL.—An individual who has
the Federal firearm owner's license of the individual revoked under this subsection may appeal the revocation determination to the Director of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives.

1	"(B) REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 14
2	days after the date on which an individual ap-
3	peals a revocation determination under sub-
4	paragraph (A), the Director of the Bureau of
5	Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives
6	shall conduct a hearing on the appeal.
7	"(C) NOTICE OF DETERMINATION.—The
8	Director of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco,
9	Firearms, and Explosives shall provide written
10	notice of the determination made after a hear-
11	ing under subparagraph (B) regarding the ap-
12	pealed revocation to the individual.
13	"(D) APPEAL.—If the Director of the Bu-
14	reau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explo-
15	sives determines after a hearing under this
16	paragraph to uphold the revocation, the deter-
17	mination may be appealed to an appropriate
18	district court of the United States.
19	"(i) Annual Background Investigations.—The
20	Attorney General shall conduct, not less frequently than
21	annually, a background investigation of each individual to
22	whom a Federal firearm owner's license is issued under
23	this section to ensure that the individual is not prohibited

from possessing a firearm under subsection (g) or (n) ofsection 922 or under State law.

1 "(j) ANNUAL REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after 2 the date of enactment of this section, and each year there-3 after, the Attorney General shall submit a report to Con-4 gress on the implementation of this section and rec-5 ommendations, if any, for improvements of the system re-6 quired to be established under this section.

7 "(k) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
8 are authorized to be appropriated to the Attorney General
9 such sums as are necessary to carry out this section.".
10 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
11 for such chapter is amended by adding at the end the fol12 lowing:

(c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
subsections (a) and (b) shall take effect on the date that
is 2 years after the date of enactment of this Act.

16 (d) REGULATIONS.—Not later than 1 year after the 17 date of enactment of this Act, the Attorney General shall 18 promulgate regulations to carry out section 935 of title 19 18, United States Code, as added by subsection (a), in-20 cluding a regulation requiring that any firearm manufac-21 tured after the effective date described in subsection (c) 22 of this section be legibly and conspicuously engraved or 23 cast with the date on which the firearm was manufac-24 tured.

2	(a) IN GENERAL.—Title I of the Omnibus Crime
3	Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (34 U.S.C. 10101
4	et seq.) is amended by adding at the end the following:
5	"PART PP—FIREARMS LICENSING
6	"SEC. 3061. DEFINITIONS.
7	"(a) IN GENERAL.—In this part—
8	"(1) the term 'covered license' means a—
9	"(A) firearms license; or
10	"(B) firearms dealer license;
11	"(2) the term 'extreme risk protection order'—
12	"(A) means a written order, issued by a
13	State court or signed by a magistrate that, for
14	a period not to exceed a time frame established
15	by the State—
16	"(i) prohibits the individual named in
17	the order from having under the custody or
18	control of the individual, purchasing, pos-
19	sessing, or receiving a firearm or ammuni-
20	tion; and
21	"(ii) requires that any firearm or am-
22	munition under the custody or control of
23	the individual be removed; and
24	"(B) does not include a domestic violence
25	protection order, as defined in section 2266 of
26	title 18, United States Code;

1	"(3) the term 'prohibited individual' means an
2	individual who is categorically ineligible to receive a
3	covered license;
4	"(4) the term 'suitable' means that an indi-
5	vidual does not create a risk to public safety; and
6	"(5) the term 'thorough background check'
7	means a Federal and State background check, which
8	may include a fingerprint-based background check.
9	"(b) Prohibited Individuals.—For purposes of
10	this part, a State—
11	"(1) shall establish standards for categorizing
12	an individual as a prohibited individual for purposes
13	of receiving a covered license; and
14	((2) in establishing standards with respect to a
15	covered license under paragraph (1), shall take into
16	consideration whether limitations may be warranted
17	based on—
18	"(A) criminal history;
19	"(B) whether an individual has been—
20	"(i) deemed a danger to himself or
21	herself or other individuals by a court or
22	authorized administrative body; or
23	"(ii) committed to a hospital or insti-
24	tution as a danger to himself or herself or
25	other individuals;

1	"(C) age;
2	"(D) legal residency;
3	"(E) military dishonorable discharges;
4	"(F) whether an individual is subject to a
5	permanent or temporary protection order or has
6	ever been convicted of a misdemeanor crime of
7	domestic violence;
8	"(G) outstanding arrest warrants;
9	"(H) status as a fugitive;
10	"(I) renunciation of United States citizen-
11	ship; and
12	((J) other factors relevant to the suit-
13	ability of a license holder.
14	"SEC. 3062. GRANTS AND CONDITIONS.
15	"(a) GRANTS AUTHORIZED.—The Assistant Attorney
16	General may make grants to States to implement or main-
17	tain firearms and firearms dealer licensing requirements.
18	"(b) DURATION OF GRANTS.—A grant under sub-
19	section (a) shall be for a period of 3 fiscal years.
20	"(c) Use of Funds for Firearms and Firearms
21	DEALER LICENSING.—
22	"(1) ACTIVITIES.—Amounts received under a
23	grant under subsection (a) shall be used for the im-
24	plementation or maintenance of firearms and fire-
25	arms dealer licensing requirements, which shall in-

1	corporate and implement the elements described in
2	paragraph (2).
3	"(2) Elements.—The elements described in
4	this paragraph are those providing that—
5	"(A) an individual shall have a firearms li-
6	cense—
7	"(i) at the time of the purchase, rent-
8	al, or lease of a firearm or purchase of am-
9	munition; and
10	"(ii) during the entire period of own-
11	ership or possession of a firearm or ammu-
12	nition;
13	"(B)(i) an individual who (including the
14	owner or operator of a business that) sells,
15	rents, or leases a minimum number of firearms,
16	or sells ammunition, during a calendar year
17	shall obtain a firearms dealer license; and
18	"(ii) the State shall establish the minimum
19	number of firearms for purposes of clause (i),
20	which may not be higher than 10 per calendar
21	year;
22	"(C) the chief of police or the board or of-
23	ficer having control of the police department of
24	a local government, or a designee within the

1	same department, shall function as the licensing
2	authority;
3	"(D) for an application for issuance or re-
4	newal of a firearms license, the licensing au-
5	thority shall—
6	"(i) conduct a thorough background
7	check, which may include—
8	"(I) conducting an interview with
9	the applicant;
10	"(II) requiring the submission of
11	letters of reference stating that the
12	applicant is of sound mind and char-
13	acter; and
14	"(III) any other requirements the
15	State determines relevant; and
16	"(ii) make a determination of suit-
17	ability;
18	"(E) a first-time firearms license applicant
19	shall complete safety training;
20	"(F) for an application for issuance or re-
21	newal of a firearms dealer license, the licensing
22	authority shall conduct an investigation into the
23	criminal history of the applicant, which may in-
24	clude—
25	"(i) an interview with the applicant;

1	"(ii) a thorough background check;
2	and
3	"(iii) any other requirements the
4	State determines relevant;
5	"(G) the State shall establish appropriate
6	application processes for covered licenses con-
7	sistent with Federal, State, and local law;
8	"(H) the State shall establish standards
9	and processes by which licensing authorities can
10	revoke, suspend, or deny the issuance or re-
11	newal of a covered license;
12	"(I) the State shall ensure that a revoca-
13	tion, suspension, or denial cannot be based on
14	race, color, ethnicity, religion, sex, sexual ori-
15	entation, or gender identity;
16	"(J) the State shall establish judicial re-
17	view processes by which any applicant for or
18	holder of a covered license may, within a rea-
19	sonable time period, petition to obtain judicial
20	review of a revocation, suspension, or denial of
21	the issuance or renewal of a covered license;
22	"(K) the State shall establish—
23	"(i) standards and a process under
24	which a family member of an individual
25	who the family member fears is a danger

1	to himself, herself, or others may petition
2	for an extreme risk protection order; and
3	"(ii) standards for the termination or
4	extension of an order described in clause
5	(i);
6	"(L) the State shall establish processes
7	under which—
8	"(i) an individual whose covered li-
9	cense is revoked or suspended, or whose
10	application for issuance or renewal of a
11	covered license is denied, shall surrender or
12	transfer all firearms and ammunition that
13	are or would have been covered by the li-
14	cense; and
15	"(ii) an individual who is subject to
16	an extreme risk protection order or a do-
17	mestic violence protection order, as defined
18	in section 2266 of title 18, United States
19	Code, shall surrender or transfer all fire-
20	arms and ammunition in the possession of
21	the individual;
22	"(M) the State shall establish requirements
23	with which a firearms dealer licensee must com-
24	ply, which—

"(i) shall include requirements relat-
ing to—
"(I) the location at which the li-
censee conducts firearm or ammuni-
tion transactions;
"(II) the manner in which the li-
censee records firearm or ammunition
transactions;
"(III) background checks for em-
ployees of the licensee; and
"(IV) any other matter that the
"(IV) any other matter that the State determines appropriate; and

State determines appropriate; and "(ii) may include requirements that a
State determines appropriate; and "(ii) may include requirements that a licensee—

6	"law enforcement officer" means a public servant
7	authorized by Federal, State, local, or Tribal law or
8	by a Federal, State, local, or Tribal government
9	agency to—
10	(A) engage in or supervise the prevention,
11	detection, investigation, or prosecution of an of-
12	fense; or
13	(B) supervise sentenced criminal offenders.
14	(6) PETITIONER.—The term "petitioner"
15	means an individual authorized under State or Trib-
16	al law to petition for an extreme risk protection
17	order.
18	(7) RESPONDENT.—The term "respondent"
19	means an individual named in the petition for an ex-
20	treme risk protection order or subject to an extreme
21	risk protection order.
22	(8) STATE.—The term "State" means—
23	(A) a State;
24	(B) the District of Columbia;

1	(C) the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico;
2	and
3	(D) any other territory or possession of the
4	United States.
5	(9) Unit of local government.—The term
6	"unit of local government" has the meaning given
7	the term in section 901 of title I of the Omnibus
8	Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (34
9	U.S.C. 10251).
10	(b) Grant Program Established.—
11	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Attorney General shall
12	establish a program under which, from amounts
13	made available to carry out this section, the Attor-
14	ney General may make grants to eligible entities to
15	assist in carrying out the provisions of the legisla-
16	tion described in subsection (c).
17	(2) USE OF FUNDS.—Funds awarded under
18	this subsection may be used by an applicant to—

(ii) the appropriate use of extreme
risk protection orders in cases of domestic
violence, including the applicability of other
policies and protocols to address domestic

1	violence in situations that may also involve

3	cessity of safety planning with the victim
4	before a law enforcement officer petitions
5	for and executes an extreme risk protection
6	order, if applicable;
7	(iii) interacting with persons with a

13	ders and associated victims of violence to

19	ices, housing assistance, case management,
20	and veterans and disability benefits.

23	protection order, if—
24	(I) the petition for an extreme
25	risk protection order alleges that the

4	(II) the court finds there is prob-
5	able cause to believe, or makes a find-
6	ing according to a higher evidentiary
7	standard established by the State or
8	Indian Tribe, that the respondent

12	(ii) DURATION OF EX PARTE EX-
13	TREME RISK PROTECTION ORDER.—An ex

17	(E) STORAGE OF REMOVED FIREARMS.—
18	(i) Availability for return.—All

3	owned by a named individual may not be
4	disposed of or destroyed during the period

8	(i) IN GENERAL.—
9	(I) REQUIREMENT.—A State or
10	Tribal court that issues an extreme
11	risk protection order shall notify the
12	Attorney General or the comparable
13	State or Tribal agency, as applicable,
14	of the order as soon as practicable or
15	within a designated period of time.
16	(II) FORM AND MANNER.—A
17	State or Tribal court shall submit a
18	notification under subclause (I) in an
19	electronic format, in a manner pre-
20	scribed by the Attorney General or the

24	der, age, disability, and English language pro-

2 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section, the terms "extreme risk protection order", "Indian Tribe", and "State" 3 have the meanings given those terms in section 401(a). 4 5 (b) FULL FAITH AND CREDIT REQUIRED.—Any extreme risk protection order issued under a State or Tribal 6 7 law enacted in accordance with this title shall be accorded 8 the same full faith and credit by the court of another State 9 or Indian Tribe (referred to in this subsection as the "enforcing State or Indian Tribe") and enforced by the court 10 11 and law enforcement personnel of the other State or Tribal 12 government as if it were the order of the enforcing State or Indian Tribe. 13

14 (c) APPLICABILITY TO EXTREME RISK PROTECTION15 ORDERS.—

16 (1) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (b) shall apply to
17 an extreme risk protection order issued by a State
18 or Tribal court if—

19 (A) the court has jurisdiction over the par20 ties and matter under the law of the State or
21 Indian Tribe; and

(B) reasonable notice and opportunity to
be heard is given to the person against whom
the order is sought sufficient to protect that
person's right to due process.

1 (2) EX PARTE EXTREME RISK PROTECTION OR-2 DERS.—For purposes of paragraph (1)(B), in the 3 case of an ex parte extreme risk protection order, 4 notice and opportunity to be heard shall be provided 5 within the time required by State or Tribal law, and 6 in any event within a reasonable time after the order 7 is issued, sufficient to protect the due process rights 8 of the respondent.

9 (d) TRIBAL COURT JURISDICTION.—For purposes of 10 this section, a court of an Indian Tribe shall have full civil 11 jurisdiction to issue and enforce an extreme risk protection 12 order involving any person, including the authority to en-13 force any order through civil contempt proceedings, to ex-14 clude violators from Indian land, and to use other appro-15 priate mechanisms, in matters arising anywhere in the In-16 dian country (as defined in section 1151 of title 18, 17 United States Code) of the Indian Tribe or otherwise within the authority of the Indian Tribe. 18
