3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Medicare Audiology"
- 5 Access Improvement Act of 2025".

6 SEC. 2. COVERAGE OF AUDIOLOGY SERVICES UNDER THE 7

- (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1861(s)(2) of the Social 8
- Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1395x(s)(2)) is amended— 9

7	(b) Improved Access to Audiology Services.—
8	Paragraph (3) of section 1861(ll) of the Social Security
9	Act (42 U.S.C. 1395x(ll)) is amended to read as follows:
10	"(3) The term 'audiology services' means such hear-
11	ing and balance assessment services and, beginning Janu-
12	ary 1, 2027, such treatment services, furnished by a quali-
13	fied audiologist which the qualified audiologist is legally
14	authorized to perform under State law (or the regulatory
15	mechanism provided by State law), as would otherwise be
16	covered if furnished by a physician or as incident to a phy-
17	sician's service. A qualified audiologist shall be permitted
18	to furnish such audiology services without regard to any
19	requirement that the individual receiving such audiology
20	services is under the care of (or referred by) a physician
21	or other health care practitioner or that such services are
22	furnished under the supervision of a physician or other
23	health care practitioner.".

(c) PAYMENT AMOUNT AND COINSURANCE.—Section
 1833(a)(1) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
 1395l(a)(1)) is amended—

4 (1) by striking "and" before (HH); and 5 (2) by inserting the following before the semi-6 colon: "and (II) with respect to audiology services 7 furnished under section 1861(s)(2)(KK). the 8 amounts paid shall be 80 percent of the lesser of the 9 actual charge for the services or the fee schedule 10 amount provided under section 1848".

(d) PAYMENT ON ASSIGNMENT-RELATED BASIS.—
12 Section 1842(b)(18)(C) of the Social Security Act (42
13 U.S.C. 1395u(b)(18)(C)) is amended by adding at the end
14 the following new clause:

15 "(ix) A qualified audiologist (as de-16 fined in section 1861(ll)(4)(B)).".

17 (e) INCLUSION OF QUALIFIED AUDIOLOGISTS AS
18 RHC AND FQHC PRACTITIONERS.—Section
19 1861(aa)(1)(B) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
20 1395x(aa)(1)(B)) is amended—

21 (1) by striking "or by a mental" and inserting22 "by a mental"; and

(2) by inserting "or by a qualified audiologist
(as defined in subsection (ll)(4)(B))," after "(as defined in subsection (lll)(4)),".

1 (f) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in the 2 amendments made by this section shall be construed to 3 expand the scope of audiology services or services for 4 which payment may be made to other providers under title 5 XVIII of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1395 et seq.) 6 beyond those services for which such payment may be 7 made as of December 31, 2026.

8 (g) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
9 this section shall apply to items and services furnished on
10 or after January 1, 2027.
