Dear Senators Warren and Blumenthal and Representative Stansbury:

On behalf of our client SoftBank Group Corp. (“SoftBank”), this letter responds to your June 30, 2026 letter to SoftBank regarding the company’s support for Presidential libraries and efforts to preserve critical elements of modern American history. We appreciate the opportunity to respond to your inquiry.

SoftBank is proud of its work in the United States and its longstanding commitment to supporting U.S. economic growth, American technology leadership, and the broader U.S.-Japan economic relationship. Through substantial investments and commitments across telecommunications, semiconductors, artificial intelligence, energy, and digital infrastructure, SoftBank has helped support U.S. domestic capacity in strategically important sectors and contributed to the competitiveness and resilience of the U.S. economy.

SoftBank’s engagement in the United States has included a broad range of philanthropic initiatives focused on disaster relief, education, and technological innovation. Following major natural disasters, SoftBank supported the California Fire Foundation and the American Red Cross. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the company donated more than one million N95 respirator masks to the State of New York to help address critical shortages of personal protective equipment during a surge in cases. SoftBank also served as an anchor sponsor of the Smithsonian Institution’s FUTURES exhibition, which highlighted emerging technologies and innovation. In addition, the company supported AI4ALL to help expand opportunities for the next generation of diverse technology leaders. Most recently, SoftBank and Arm made a significant contribution to support collaborative AI research between Carnegie Mellon University and Keio University. The initiative includes funding for research opportunities, fellowships, internships, and student programming to strengthen the future AI talent pipeline. Lastly, SoftBank recently committed to a \$40 million Community Benefits Agreement to support communities in southern Ohio.

Consistent with this broader commitment to supporting educational and civic institutions in the United States, SoftBank has also supported nonprofit organizations established to facilitate the construction and operation of Presidential libraries and/or museums

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(often referred to collectively as “Presidential libraries”). Presidential libraries play an important role in preserving the records, artifacts, and public understanding of American Presidential administrations and making those materials available for study, discussion, and public education.

Since the early twentieth century, each American President has established a library to house the documents and artifacts of his administration and make them available to the public for study and discussion. Presidential libraries are constructed with private or other non-federal funds donated to nonprofit 501(c)(3) organizations, typically for the express purpose of building a Presidential library and supporting its programs. Relying on ongoing public and private funding, these institutions offer the public an opportunity to experience rotating exhibits focused on American history and the American experience, as well as educational programming often linked to local school curricula.

Recognizing the important role Presidential libraries play in the fabric of American life, SoftBank has donated to the nonprofit organizations established by multiple Presidents to facilitate the construction and operation of their libraries. Most recently, in January 2026, the company made a \$50 million contribution to the Donald J. Trump Presidential Library Foundation, Inc. As with its prior contributions to Presidential libraries, SoftBank understands that this donation will be used to support the construction and operation of the Donald J. Trump Presidential Library. In particular, the company understands that its donation will help support the creation of a dedicated space in the forthcoming Library highlighting the strength of the U.S.-Japan relationship.

SoftBank is proud of its support for institutions dedicated to preserving American history while continuing its commitment to investing in America’s future. Thank you for your letter and the opportunity to explain SoftBank’s support for Presidential libraries.
